	Assumptions	Likelihood	Comments
1	ABF do not approve the issuing of IAP points as an incentive to reward compliant behaviour.	Likely	There is no reason for asylum seekers to move other than to being directed by police and risking breaking the law. This move may be perceived as a strategy to force the residents who are now refugees to leave the RPC by essentially separating the cohorts to enable part of the RPC to be converted into a settlement site similar to EL
2	That asylum seekers can be moved to their new accommodation at the rate of 24 asylum seekers per hour.	Unlikely	The staff consider the rate at which asylum seekers can be moved from compound to compound more likely to be approximately 10 per hour, this will depend upon compliance
3	That the moves will be conducted from 08:00 - 12:00 Lunch 13:00 - 17:00 Dinner 18:00 - 20:00 End.	Likely	Breakfast would be available at normal times and asylum seekers would have to attend breakfast based on their program.
4	That there are additional staff made available to resource the move.	Likely	If it is only four teams this is likely the main risk is the staff required to manage non-compliant residents
5	That P & A is not required on the day of the move and ABF accept an EPF	Moderate	With all the asylum seekers participating in the move it is not feasible to conduct P&A, this may be a distraction and residents participating may not want to stop participating and move,
6	That ABF are able to provide the interpreters as detailed in the plan	Moderate	With major moves required in all of the compounds interpreters will be essential both in messaging as well as negotiations particularly for non-compliant residents
7	Due to the compressed timeframes this is more a security operation rather than the preferred option of a welfare lead operation.	Likely	In the past on moves like this the asylum seeker welfare has always been the priority, however with compressed timeframes police will need to be referred to sooner to meet the timeframes.
8	That police are available to support the activity and the required numbers are available and trained in managing refugees and understand the requirements	Unlikely	The mobile force will be new to the RPC and will not be trained, this could lead to catastrophic consequences if the mover quickly becomes a security lead move rather than a welfare lead move.
8	There will be several residents who will be non-compliant that will put pressure on the accommodation alternatives	Likely	We need a legal position on what powers the police have to force residents to move if they refuse but do it passively.
