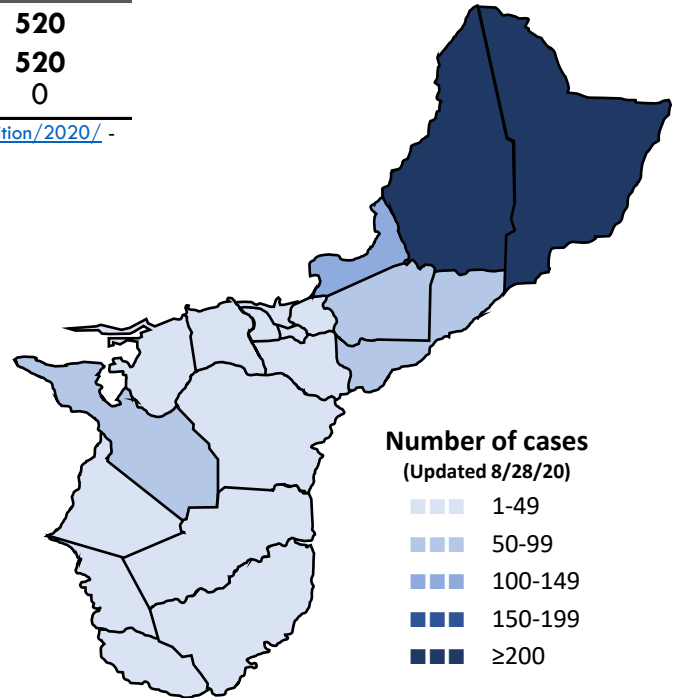
### Summary

As of August 28, 2020, there have been 1,287 cases of COVID-19 reported on Guam. Fifty-five (55) new cases of COVID-19 were reported to DPHSS on August 27.

On August 27, 22 cases tested positive at DoD, 19 cases tested positive at GPLH, six cases tested positive at GMHA, four cases tested positive at DLS, three cases tested positive at AMC, and one case tested positive at GRMC. These cases are under investigation.

Twenty-six cases were identified through contact tracing.

Thirty-two cases were reported released from isolation.



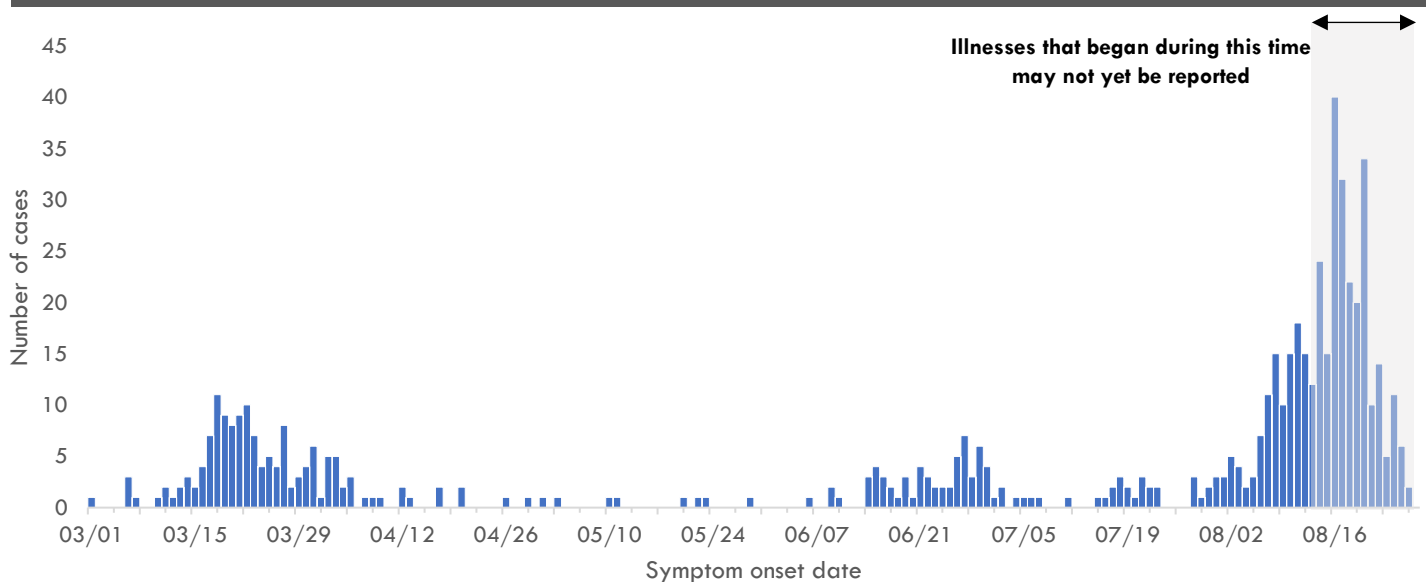

### Confirmed COVID-19 cases by symptom onset date, Guam





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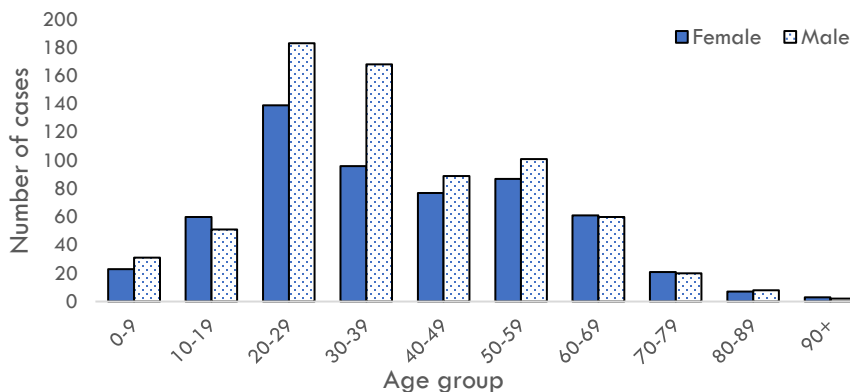

### Confirmed COVID-19 cases by age group and sex

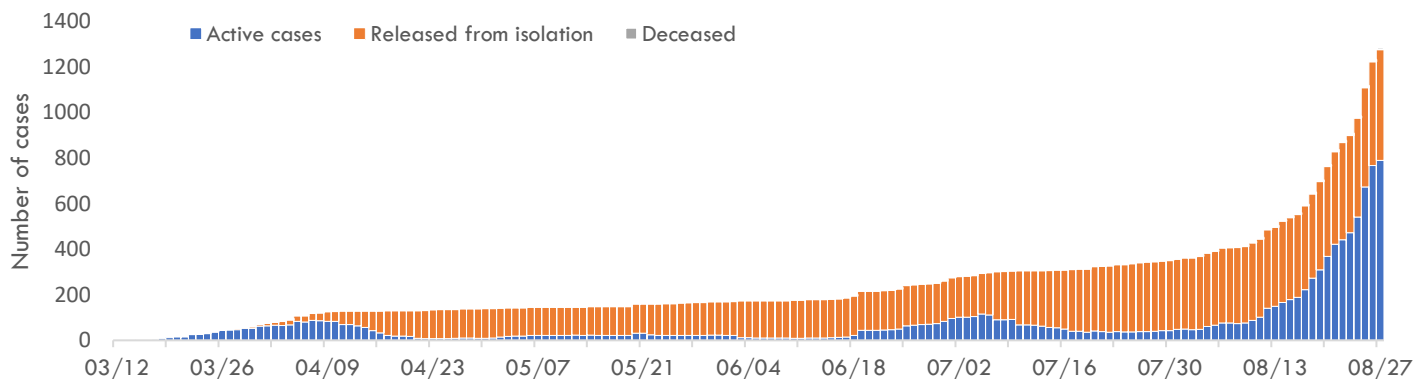


<sup>†</sup> Cases that require isolation: 1) have a positive molecular test or 2) are clinically diagnosed with COVID-19 (classified as probable cases). Cases that test positive for COVID-19 through follow-up molecular testing return to active isolation.

<sup>§</sup> Cases are released from isolation under criteria outlined on page 4. Generally, the criteria assess time since COVID-19 symptom resolution and the date of their most recent positive molecular test to qualify for release from isolation. Cases that have only a positive serology test do not require isolation.

<sup>¶</sup> In the 14 days before symptom onset. Some cases traveled to more than one country.

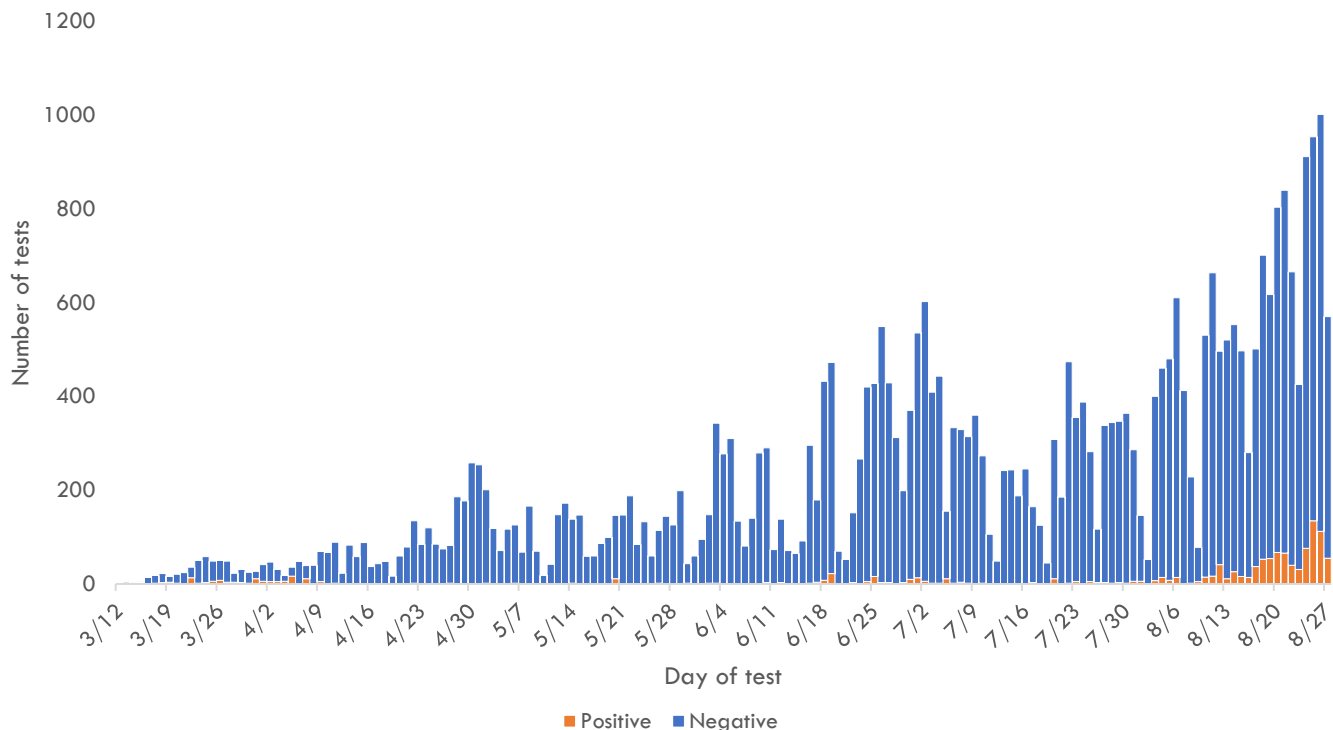

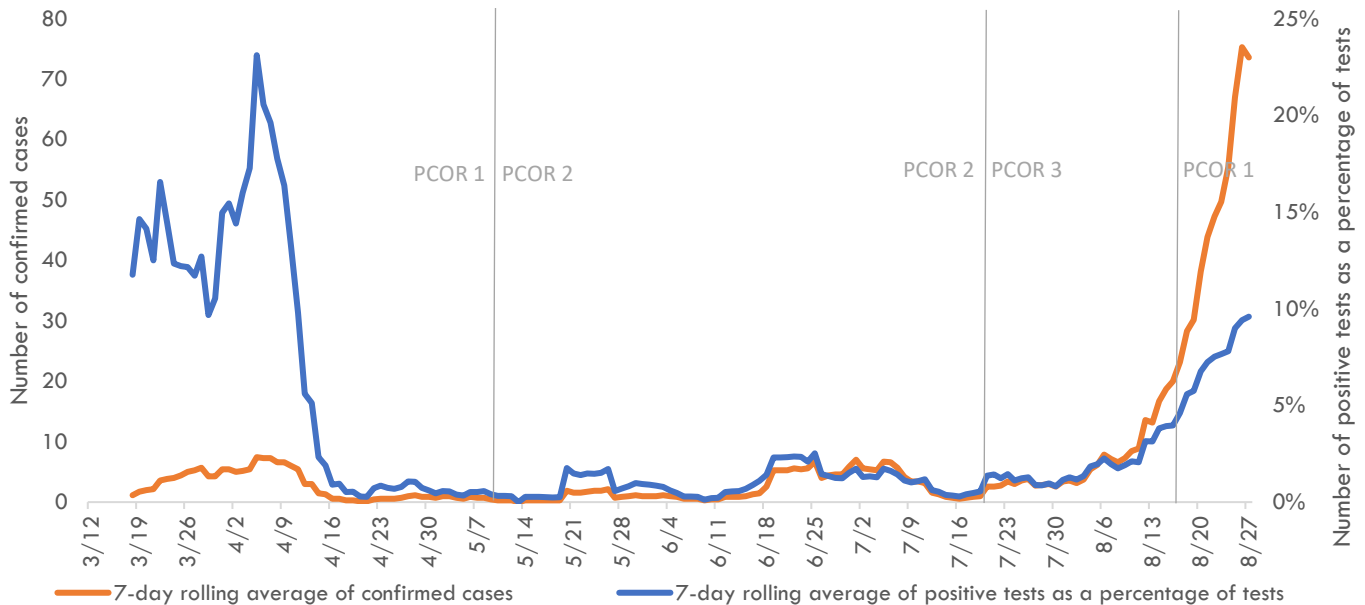


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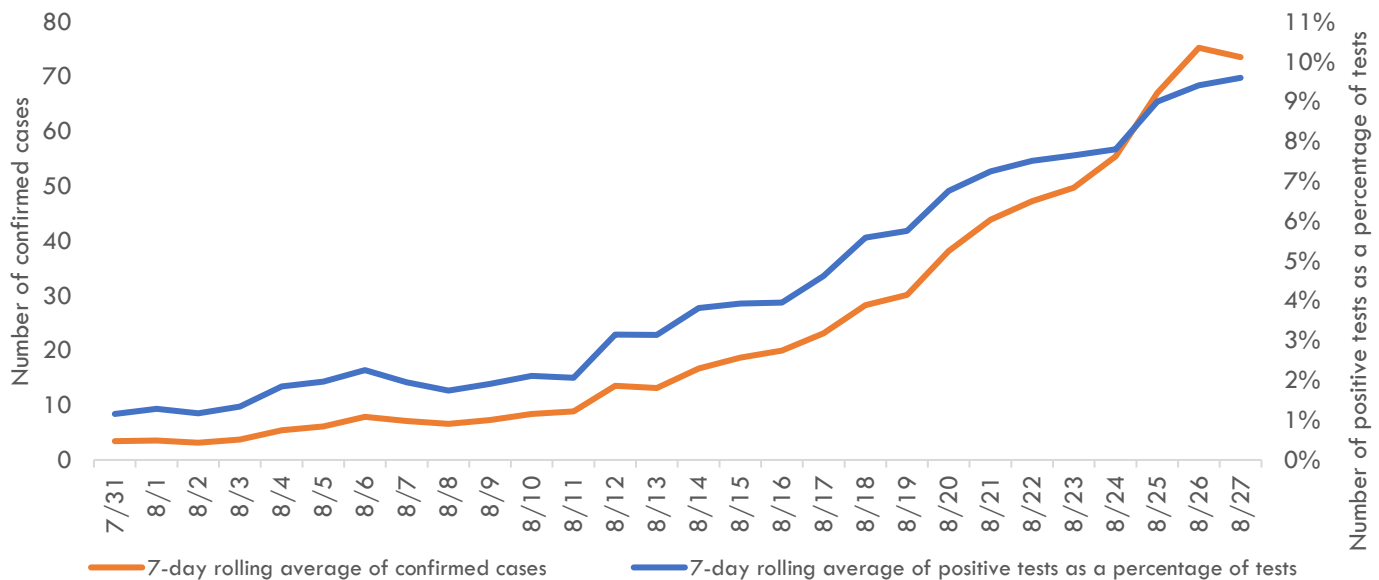

#### † Criteria for release from isolation

*For persons with mild to moderate illness who are not severely immunocompromised:*

For persons having symptoms: At least 3 days have passed since recovery defined as resolution of fever without the use of fever-reducing medications and improvement in respiratory symptoms (e.g., cough, shortness of breath) and any other symptoms attributed to COVID-19 AND at least 10 days have passed since symptoms first appeared—or since recurrent symptoms appeared—AND at least 10 days have passed since the date of their first (or most recent) positive COVID-19 diagnostic test.

For persons without symptoms: At least 10 days have passed since the date of their first (or most recent) positive COVID-19 diagnostic test assuming they have not subsequently developed symptoms since their positive test.

*For persons with severe to critical illness or who are severely immunocompromised:*

For persons having symptoms: At least 10 days have passed since symptoms first appeared, up to 20 days.

For persons without symptoms: At least 10 days have passed since the date of their first positive COVID-19 diagnostic test, up to 20 days.
